DEBATE AND MODERN MINDS - Ms Lucia Manzoni

This club is a space for students to sharpen their public speaking, critical thinking, and argumentation skills through philosophy, fostering an inclusive community that values diverse perspectives, mutual respect, and shared inquiry. Members engage in structured debates on current events, ethics, and global issues, while also exploring modern ideas and innovations shaping the world.

 Day/Time: 1 lesson a week - TUESDAY from 15.30 till 16.30
 Annual cost: € 650,00

SCIENCE CLUB - Mr Svend & Ms Eliza

This club enhances the science experience at Andersen and opens the world of science and technology to participating students. The course is designed to address a diverse array of themes, including the exploration of life in space, the study of the human genome, the interplay between technology and the natural world, and the pervasive influence of chemistry in daily life.

Participants: MYP and DP students (min. No. 6)
 Day/Time: 1 lesson a week - TUESDAY from 15.30 till 16.30
 Annual cost: € 650,00 + material around € 150/200

THEATRE CLUB - Mr Mauro Di Vincenzo

This club offers students the chance to explore acting and stage performance in a supportive, creative environment. Through drama games, improvisation, and rehearsals, students will develop expressive communication and teamwork. The club aims to build confidence, encourage creativity, and help students think critically while working together to bring scenes and performances to life. There will be a final performance - written and created by the students.

Participants: MYP and DP students (min. No. 4)
 Day/Time: 1 lesson a week - WEDNESDAY from 15.30 till 16.30
 Annual cost: € 500,00

MUN (Model United Nations) - Ms Hetal Patel

Model United Nations club is a simulation of the procedures used by the United Nations. Students act as delegates or chairs, representing a country, different to their own, to discuss a matter of global concern as part of a specialized committee at a conference.

Collectively, students learn to negotiate, debate and develop a resolution on a topical issue. Participation in the club will enhance formal English speaking skills, critical thinking, leadership, team-work and global awareness.

Participants: MYP and DP students (min. No. 5)

Day/Time: 1 lesson a week - WEDNESDAY from 15.30 till 16.30

Annual cost: € 450,00 + MUN conferences in Milan (approximately € 100 each) and one potential trip to a conference abroad (not compulsory)

GAMES CLUB - Mr Johnathan Gregg

This club is a fun and social space where students come together to play a variety of card and board games, including strategy, cooperative, and logic-based games. As the year progresses, students will have the chance to design and create their own games—potentially using technology and coding. The club promotes teamwork, creativity, and problem-solving, while also helping students develop communication and critical thinking skills in an engaging and supportive environment.

Annual cost: € 650,00
